Yesterday in worship we lit the Peace candle-a reminder that, as Christians, we find our peace in Christ Jesus.

This coming Sunday, December 12, the youth and children of St. Paul will lead worship with their Christmas worship service. We encourage you to attend worship either in person or via Facebook Live.

Christmas Eve at St. Paul:

5:00-7:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Open House. We will have pre-recorded music (from our own musicians) and readings. Pastor Becky will provide Quiet Communion. The Open House format allows you at attend for any length of time that works for you and your family.

11:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Candlelight/Communion Worship. We will worship both in the sanctuary and via Facebook Live at 11:00 p.m. Christmas Eve. All are welcome

This Advent/Christmas seasons St. Paul will not be sponsoring specific families in the community for Christmas gifts. Our staff simply does not have the allotted time to coordinate this project. However, if you would like to provide local families with assistance, you can drop gift cards at the church office. We recommend WalMart, Dollar General, Dollar Tree, Aldi and Kroger. We will distribute these cards to families no later than mid-December. Thank you for your generosity and your understanding.

We end with a reminder about Covid19 transmissions. Incidences of positive cases are going up in our congregation and community. If you have been in contact with someone who either tests positive for Covid19 or have been in contact with someone who soon after you've been with them tests positive, you need to quarantine yourself from St. Paul Church, its building, and its staff.

It is our goal to keep one another (and our neighbors) as healthy as possible. What's more, if essential staff become infected, we will be forced to shut down worship, weekly mailers, and all programs for two weeks. We thank you for your attention and care. We know it is difficult to stay home. Isolation is hard. And yet, it is our Christian calling to care for one another in the best way possible.

Read: Read the key verses from Sunday's reading.

¹⁰For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, "so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. (Isaiah 55:10-11)

Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

God's people were exiled and had lost everythingexcept God's word. As long as they continued to speak and hear the word of God, that word would accomplish its purpose-the restoration of Israel one day.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?

What kinds of words do you speak? Are your words angry, gentle, spiteful, generous, bitter, meaningful? What do your words say about you?

How does a word "accomplish that which I purpose"? (Go out into the world and return full.) Just how powerful are words?

For the littles: Do you like to talk a lot or a little?

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God bless your words going out and coming in. Amen.



Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.

Create a "bitter words" jar. Decide on an amount of money each member of the household will put in for every time they swear, speak words that sting, are bitter, or are ungrateful. Decide together how you will use the money collectedperhaps give it away!
