Maintenance Report: John Mohrmon

- Working with the maintenance trainee and the trustees.
- Performed weekly and monthly preventive maintenance checks.
- Set clocks to daylight savings time.
- NuWave Technologies installed programmable lock on east educational building entrance. Both east and west educational building doors now controlled by these locks. Fobs and pin numbers issued to who need frequent access. We are working through minor glitches.
- All outside access doors for the sanctuary and educational buildings rekeyed with limited distribution of these keys.
- The left column of modules of the electronic sign on the west side of the educational building quit working. Worked with the sign company and found a power supply was not working. They shipped us a new power supply to be installed before the council meeting.
- One end of the lights above the curtains behind the alter in the sanctuary dropped down about a foot. A majority of the screws holding fell out. Put it back in place with longer screws.
- Other small things taken care of as needed.

Again, thank you to so many who have been so kind and taught me so much.


