

Leader: God has come to us in Christ, but often we live as if that makes no difference. Let us confess our sins before God and one another. Let us pray.



NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Matthew 7:1-14, 24-29 (The Message) Jesus said, "Don't pick on people, jump on their failures, criticize their faults—unless, of course, you want the same treatment. That critical spirit has a way of boomeranging. It's easy to see a smudge on your neighbor's face and be oblivious to the ugly sneer on your own. Do you have the nerve to say, 'Let me wash your face for you,' when your own face is distorted by contempt? It's this whole traveling road-show mentality all over again, playing a holier-than-thou part instead of just living your part. Wipe that ugly sneer off your own face, and you might be fit to offer a washcloth to your neighbor.

<sup>6</sup> "Don't be flip with the sacred. Banter and silliness give no honor to God. Don't reduce holy mysteries to slogans. In trying to be relevant, you're only being cute and inviting sacrilege.

<sup>7-11</sup> "Don't bargain with God. Be direct. Ask for what you need. This isn't a cat-and-mouse, hide-and-seek game we're in. If your child asks for bread, do you trick him with sawdust? If he asks for fish, do you scare him with a live snake on his plate? As bad as you are, you wouldn't think of such a thing. You're at least decent to your own children. So don't you think the God who conceived you in love will be even better?

<sup>12</sup> "Here is a simple, rule-of-thumb guide for behavior: Ask yourself what you want people to do for you, then grab the initiative and do it for them. Add up God's Law and Prophets and this is what you get.

"Don't look for shortcuts to God. The market is flooded with surefire, easygoing formulas for a successful life that can be practiced in your spare time. Don't fall for that stuff, even though crowds of people do. The way to life—to God!—is vigorous and requires total attention. "These words I speak to you are not incidental additions to your life, homeowner improvements to your standard of living. They are foundational words, words to build a life on. If you work these words into your life, you are like a smart carpenter who built his house on solid rock. Rain poured down, the river flooded, a tornado hit—but nothing moved that house. It was fixed to the rock.

<sup>26-27</sup> "But if you just use my words in Bible studies and don't work them into your life, you are like a stupid carpenter who built his house on the sandy beach. When a storm rolled in and the waves came up, it collapsed like a house of cards."

<sup>28-29</sup> When Jesus concluded his address, the crowd burst into applause. They had never heard teaching like this. It was apparent that he was living everything he was saying—quite a contrast to their religion teachers! This was the best teaching they had ever heard.



#### February Monthly Mission: Back Bay Mission

Back Bay Mission has been located in Biloxi Mississippi since 1922 and has just celebrated its 100th anniversary. It was founded by the Evangelical Reformed Church which is one of the four founding denominations of the United Church of Christ.

Back Bay Mission has been a mission partner of the UCC for 100 years and volunteers have given their time, money and help to the people of this area of Southern Mississippi. Many members of St Paul have been on mission trips to Back Bay over the years and have learned about the poverty and homelessness of Southern Mississippi. Mississippi is still the poorest state in the Union and Back Bay Mission is doing more than its share to help the people of this area.

Back Bay has a Day Care Center where people can go for a shower, a place to use a computer to look for job opportunities, a food pantry, a washing machine, as well as mental and physical professional help if needed. Other ways the mission helps, is with offering clothing donations and finding suitable housing for people.

Our St Paul UCC Church has supported this Mission financially and with work groups for many years. Over the past number of years Back Bay has gained the support of some of the Casinos, The Air Force Base which is located near Biloxi, some businesses, and the local Chamber of Commerce, as well as individuals.

St Paul members have been on many trips to Back Bay and they have seen the ongoing needs of the very poor people of Southern Mississippi. They have helped with cleaning out homes that have been damaged by hurricanes and flooded by some terrible storms and have helped with the rebuilding of these homes. The people that are helped are always so gracious and thankful for any help that they receive

The Motto for Back Bay Mission is taken from the Book of Micah and says "To do Justice, Love kindness, and Walk humbly with God" Remember- God loves a Cheerful Giver!
