

Early in the morning on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone was moved away from the entrance. She ran at once to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, breathlessly panting, "They took the Master from the tomb. We don't know where they've put him."

ran, neck and neck. The other disciple got to the tomb first, outrunning Peter. Stooping to look in, he saw the pieces of linen cloth lying there, but he didn't go in. Simon Peter arrived after him, entered the tomb, observed the linen cloths lying there, and the kerchief used to cover his head not lying with the linen cloths but separate, neatly folded by itself. Then the other disciple, the one who had gotten there first, went into the tomb, took one look at the evidence, and believed. No one yet knew from the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead. The disciples then went back home.

¹¹⁻¹³ But Mary stood outside the tomb weeping. As she wept, she knelt to look into the tomb and saw two angels sitting there, dressed in white, one at the head, the other at the foot of where Jesus' body had been laid. They said to her, "Woman, why do you weep?"

SERMON

Jesus Among Us!

God is not afraid of new things.
--Pope Francis

This is the day that Christians the world over have been waiting for! Easter morning! Today is the day in which we rejoice, in which we raise alleluias to God for what he has done through Christ Jesus. The good news for us today is this: because Christ was raised from death, we too, can rise to new life through him.

Daniel Berrigan—a poet, peace activist, and priest—had this to say about Easter: We have longed to taste the resurrection. We have longed to welcome its thunder and quakes and to echo its great gifts. We want to taste the resurrection in our bones.

We long to taste resurrection. We want to taste resurrection in our bones. On this glorious morning we see signs of new life all around us. The flowers are in bloom. The trees are beginning to bud. The squirrels and birds frolic with abandon.

And what about each of us?

We have arrived here on Easter morn in our Sunday best. The family feasts are prepared and we can look forward to an afternoon of good food, laughter, and perhaps a decent nap. But what does any of this have to do with the resurrection life?

Perhaps we are like the disciples Simon Peter and John. Mary Magdalene has passed along a rumor that the Lord's body is no longer in the tomb, but we have to run to see for ourselves. YET—even as we see that his body is missing, we still are not convinced that Jesus has been raised from the dead. We WANT to believe, but so much has happened in our lives that we are afraid to believe in miracles. So what do we do?

We turn around and head back home. We shut our doors and our hearts to the new life that is literally bursting from the grave.

Perhaps we are like Mary Magdalene. After finding the tomb empty, we share the news with Simon Peter and John, but they weren't much help. Like Mary, we wear our hearts on our sleeves as we sob at such great a loss—the death of our Master and Friend. Like Mary, at times we are so caught up in despair that we do not even recognize Christ until he calls us by name.

Today, my dear friends, **you** have been called by name by Christ Jesus—the Risen Lord! He calls to each of us: rich and poor, young and old, male and female, saint and sinner alike.

And what do we do in response?

Like Mary Magdalene, we run and tell the good news! We let the world know that Christ has risen, indeed, and that we are now—forever and ever—Easter People.

Who do we tell this wonderful news?

How about beginning with your family: when you say your table grace today, include prayers of joy for the gift of new life.

How about your neighbors? Reach out to them in kindness and love. SHOW them Christ's love.

How about strangers? Accept them. Welcome them. BE Christ to each person you meet.

How about your enemies? Love them. Walk a mile or two in their shoes. Reconcile in ways that brokenness, enmity and despair will have no place in your life.

For here is the Easter good news: because Christ rose from the dead, we, too, are called to live a new life. We are called to be resurrection people. To literally and figuratively run full-tilt to share with others how your life is a new creation altogether. To BE the Jesus to your family, your neighbors, strangers and YES: even your enemies.

Our Psalm reading is a psalm of salvation joy. It is a psalm of thanksgiving for all that God has done in our lives. It is a reminder that what we might want to reject and scorn is the greatest of all.

We are Christians because of God's work through Jesus. We are Christians because God made certain death did not have the final say. We are Christians because we follow Jesus—not only on holidays, but every day of our lives.

Dear Friends, as Christians in this holy place, we are called to live as children of the resurrection, as new creations. We need not be like Simon Peter and John: afraid of the miracles God has in store for us.

Instead, we need to follow in the footsteps of Mary Magdalene who was called by name by Jesus and who then couldn't contain her joy as she spread the good news of Christ's resurrection.

On Easter morning, we celebrate, we dance, we sing, we laugh with joy because Christ is alive and death will never, never have the last word. This is the message that we share with our families, our neighbors, our co-workers, our enemies and beyond. This is the message of life and life abundant.

In a few moments we will be sharing in communion—Christ's holy meal. As we break the bread and share the cup, let us be nourished by Jesus Christ who heals us, loves us, accepts us, forgives us, and calls us his own.


Now THAT is something we need to go and tell the world! Amen.


