Do: By acting on what we learn, we make God's word come alive. Do the following activity this week.




As God calls our congregations to be the church in new ways, your generosity will plant new churches, awaken new ideas in existing churches and develop the spiritual life in our youth and young adults.







NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Acts 2:1-21

(NRSV)


Today's scripture lesson will be interactive.

Whenever you hear the word "wind", please make a **whooshing** sound.

When you hear the word "tongues", please place your hand above your head, symbolizing the flames of fire.

When you hear the word "Spirit" use the sign language sign for spirit.

(To sign *spirit*, form both hands into the ASL <u>letter F</u>, with the non-dominant palm facing up and the dominant palm facing down. Then starting with both 'F' hands touching at the index fingers and thumbs, shimmy the dominant 'F' hand upward, as if a genie was coming out of a bottle. Your non-dominant hand remains still.



When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵ Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶ And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷ Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹ Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." ¹² All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³ But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

¹⁴ But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵ Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

17 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my **Spirit** upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

18 Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my **Spirit**; and they shall prophesy.

¹⁹ And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

²⁰ The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood,

before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

²¹ Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

LITANY OF RESPONSE

Leader: The images of Pentecost are striking.

People: The locked room. The violent rush of wind. The tongues of fire.

Leader: And now, the speaking in tongues.

People: How confusing that must have been, both for the disciples and their listeners!

Leader: Simple folk from Galilee, people who would not have learned another language, much less many languages.

People: Were suddenly understandable to everyone.

Leader: This is the power of God's Holy Spirit.

People: This is the power of that Spirit working in the disciples, that Pentecost Day long ago.

Leader: Dramatically, Jesus' friends became equipped to spread God's word everywhere.

People: It was a miracle, and many that day came to believe.

Leader: May we ask: where is that Spirit today?

People: We are so strange and incomprehensible to one another.

Leader: Even when we speak the same language, much less different ones.

People: We need God's Spirit in this world, now more than ever.

Leader: But there is good news, very good news.

People: The Spirit of God is right here, in and with each one of us.

Leader: Inspired by that Spirit, we can unleash its great power to do good.

People: We just need to go out into the world fearlessly, knowing we are never alone.

Leader: And even if we cannot speak a word of French or Mandarin or Swahili,

People: We can let our actions and our lives do the talking for us.

Leader; There are times and places when words fail—even the clearest and most well-chosen words,

People: Where there are hurts too deep, when people are too devastated to listen.

Leader: That's when we need to call on the Spirit within us, to reach out to these suffering sisters and brothers in faith and love,

People: To offer a smile, a helping hand,

Leader: To stand with them in their time of need,

People: To walk beside them when they are in danger.

Leader: Even without wind and fire and miraculous instant communication, God's power is alive and well and visible in this world through us.

People: Because the Spirit is housed in our hearts, we can work wonders every bit as important as those worked by the first disciples.

Leader: God was with them, but God is also with us.

People: Let us look for ways to make everyday miracles happen, trusting in the continuing power of the Holy Spirit. May it be so, today and always!

SUNG RESPONSE

Here I Am!

Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry.

I will turn their mourning into joy,

I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow.

-Jeremiah 31:13

I'm absolutely positive I say this every Pentecost, but this is my favorite day in the church calendar/liturgical year. Why? Because the image of the Holy Spirit whooshing into our hearts and into our lives always makes me joyful. Because of the Holy Spirit, we are each uniquely gifted for ministry in all its forms. Because of the Holy Spirit, we are sent out to serve others. Because of the Holy Spirit, God's voice is embedded deep within each of us—challenging us, comforting us, whispering to us, transforming our lives.

Indeed, Pentecost invites us to BOTH rejoice and to serve (especially to serve the downtrodden). Pentecost invites us to shout and sing and dance, all the while sending us out to share the joy we experience through the Holy Spirit.

I am going to tell you a story that encapsulates what it means to be Spirit-filled. It is a story that happened in 2015, but I didn't read about it until this spring. And when I first heard/read the story, I knew I needed to share it with you on Pentecost.

In February 2015 Sean O'Brien from the United Kingdom was captured on video dancing at a party. You could tell that Sean was thrilled to be at the party, thrilled to be dancing, but the video went viral for all the wrong reasons. Why? Because Sean is a larger person and the video and subsequent pictures were distributed throughout social media mocking his size and mocking him for thinking he could dance. The caption of the picture on social media was "I saw this specimen."

As you can imagine, Sean was devastated when he found out what happened. But then something amazing took place. A small group of celebrities began to speak up against bullying and body-shaming. They decided to throw a dance party for Sean, but they didn't know his name or how to find him. Using social media, they sent out posts asking people to be on the lookout for this man.

When they found Sean, they reached out to him—inviting him to Los Angeles for a party. Let's hear Sean's version of what happened next:

Did you catch the joy in Sean's words? What could have easily been a devastating life blow, was turned into gifts of grace and joy by strangers.

But the story didn't end with that one dance party for Sean. The people who planned the dance party for a bullied stranger realized they had a celebrity platform to make a difference in the lives of many adults who still are recipients of bullying and body-shaming. They founded an organization called Dance Free Movement—intent on transforming the lives of those who are bullied that they might know joy, love, and acceptance.

This is Dance Free Movement's mission statement: The immediate call to action is bringing awareness to the severity of bullying and body shaming and to address the impact it is having on our culture. Our goal is to encourage people to dance and have comfort in their own skin without fear of shame. We intend on addressing the way adults are communicating to and about each other to create better examples for the children we teach. Our dream is a world with a strong infrastructure of acceptance within each other and ourselves. If we can help inspire a stronger sense of self-worth, we can all dance with a little more joy in our step.

Friends: isn't that what being a Pentecost/Spirit-filled Christian is all about? To dedicate our lives to reaching out to those who are bullied, tormented, lost and alone. To focus our energies on feeding the many deep hungers in others. To make it our life's calling to create spaces for joy to emerge.

I am well aware that very few of us have the financial resources to pull off dance parties for strangers. But that should not be an excuse to do nothing. You already know the name of someone in your orbit who is being shamed or insulted or denigrated for who they are. Reach out to that person. Offer love and acceptance.

Maybe the name of someone experiencing shame and bullying isn't coming immediately to mind. No worries. Volunteer at our schools.

Volunteer in our Sunday School. Pay attention to the kids in your neighborhood. Be a loving presence for children who might not experience love at home.

Here's another idea: choose your words carefully. Often what we try to say as a joke is actually at the expense of someone else. Our words can be used to harm or to heal. Allow the Spirit to fill you with healing and hope-filled words. We need to be careful how we speak to children AND adults for many adults are broken children in adult bodies.

Or, perhaps that person who feels shame and insecurity is you. Perhaps you've been conditioned throughout your life to think so poorly of yourself that you don't know how to love yourself. Here is the truth of our faith: you are loved beyond measure. You are loved by God through Jesus. You are filled with the Holy Spirit. And, if all of that feels too far away, you are loved by me. I love you.


The story of Pentecost is a reminder that we cannot keep our faith hidden and locked away. We must, absolutely must, get out into the community to share God's love, lifting up those around us, seeing one another through the eyes of Jesus.

COMMUNION PRAYER

Leader: Let us pray. Holy Spirit, Mighty God, Gentle Jesus, it is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give you thanks.

People: In the beginning your Spirit moved over the face of the waters. You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away and our love failed, your love remained steadfast.

Leader: Your Spirit came upon prophets and teachers, anointing them to speak your Word.

People: And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

All: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Leader: Holy are you and blessed is your son, Jesus Christ. At his baptism in the Jordan, your Spirit descended upon him and you declared him your beloved son.

People: With your Spirit upon him, he turned away the temptation of sin. Your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind.

Leader: Jesus healed the sick, fed the hungry and ate with sinners. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your church, delivered us from bondage to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

People: When the Lord Jesus ascended, he promised to be with us always, baptizing us with the Holy Spirit and with fire, as on the day of Pentecost.

Leader: We ask your blessing be upon us, O God, as we gather around this table and are nourished by the Risen Christ. Pour your Holy Spirit upon this Bread and this Cup that their transformation might transform our lives.

People: Amen.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Leader: On the night of betrayal and desertion, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, giving it to his disciples saying, "Take and eat. This is my body broken for you." He also took the cup after supper saying, "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it in remembrance of me.

SHARING THE JOYFUL FEAST


PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING (in unison)
