This passage promises to accomplish in us more than we could want or hope (Ephesians 3:20-21). Consider the times you have worried about not living as God's good soil (Matthew 13:23) then use the words of Isaiah 55:10-13 as a prayer of thanksgiving for making your life the good soil that receives life in Christ as a gift of the Holy Spirit.

Conclude by praying the Lord's Prayer.

Enjoy some time working in the soil. Work with soil in pots or planters or in your garden or yard. You may volunteer some time to assist a neighbor or someone in your community to work in their garden or yard.


#### RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



## NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Luke 19:11-27 (The Message)

While Jesus had their attention, and because they were getting close to Jerusalem by this time and expectation was building that God's kingdom would appear any minute, he told this story:

12-13 "There was once a man descended from a royal house who needed to make a long trip back to headquarters to get authorization for his rule and then return. But first he called ten servants together, gave them each a sum of money, and instructed them, 'Operate with this until I return.'

<sup>14</sup> "But the citizens there hated him. So they sent a commission with a signed petition to oppose his rule: 'We don't want this man to rule us.'

15 "When he came back bringing the authorization of his rule, he called those ten servants to whom he had given the money to find out how they had done.

16 "The first said, 'Master, I doubled your money.'

<sup>17</sup> "He said, 'Good servant! Great work! Because you've been trustworthy in this small job, I'm making you governor of ten towns.'

<sup>18</sup> "The second said, 'Master, I made a fifty percent profit on your money.'

<sup>19</sup> "He said, 'I'm putting you in charge of five towns.'

<sup>20-21</sup> "The next servant said, 'Master, here's your money safe and sound. I kept it hidden in the cellar. To tell you the truth, I was a little afraid. I know you have high standards and hate sloppiness, and don't suffer fools gladly.'

<sup>22-23</sup> "He said, 'You're right that I don't suffer fools gladly—and you've acted the fool! Why didn't you at least invest the money in securities so I would have gotten a little interest on it?'

<sup>24</sup> "Then he said to those standing there, 'Take the money from him and give it to the servant who doubled my stake.'

<sup>25</sup> "They said, 'But Master, he already has double . . .'

<sup>26</sup> "Jesus said, 'That's what I mean: Risk your life and get more than you ever dreamed of. Play it safe and end up holding the bag.

<sup>27</sup> "As for these enemies of mine who petitioned against my rule, clear them out of here. I don't want to see their faces around here again."

## SERMON

Sam Simon with Rev. Becky Erb Strang Becky: Throughout this summer, we have explored Jesus' parables. Many of them (most of them!) give glimpses of God's Kingdom-a Kingdom we can experience here on earth. Kingdom-building is our sacred calling as Christians. We are tasked by Jesus to help bring God's Kingdom to those who are on the edges: the hungry, the hurting, the grieving, the lost. Today's parable reminds us that Kingdom-building is always risky: pushing beyond our comfort zones and into a life that requires complete trust in God through Jesus.

Sam Simon is a man who places his trust in God. He preached for us last summer and I've invited him to share the good news with us again. The format for today's sermon will be questions and answers. I encourage

you to listen closely as Sam shares with us his vision for the Kingdom of Heaven here and now.

Becky: Sam, what does the Kingdom of God/the Kingdom of Heaven look like to you?

Sam: When I'm happy with my aide, my family. I'm happy doing good. I'm happy with my aunts Lori and Kim and they are happy because I am doing good. I have opened my eyes.

Becky: The king in today's Bible story gave his servants responsibilities over some of his money. What are some responsibilities you have?

Sam: Cleaning my apartment. Listening to my aide and aunts. Being more independent.

Becky: When do you know you have done a good job?

Sam: I do a good job when I listen to my aide and my aunts.

Becky: Some of the servants in Jesus' parable took big risks—and those risks came with big rewards. What big risk have you taken in your life? How did it turn out?

Sam: Moving out of my mom's house. I wondered, "Who would help me out?" It turned out good. I thank God that I moved out. I grew. My sister now asks me to help out.

Becky: How do you show God how much you love and trust him?

Sam: God asks me to open my eyes to see what I've got.

Becky: What words of hope do you have for the people of St. Paul Church?

Sam: Go outside. Look around. See the grass, animals and flowers. Think about everyone else: your family, your friends. Go to a neighbor's house.


Becky: Sam—thank you for sharing. Friends—did you hear what Sam Simon had to say to us? The Kingdom of God/the Kingdom of Heaven is a place of happiness and joy. Like Sam, I challenge you to seek happiness and joy in your life.

Sam also challenges us to take responsibility for our lives and our decisions—to be unafraid to take risks. Kingdom-building: working as a faith community to bring God's kingdom on earth as it is in heaven, is risky. It requires stepping up to new responsibilities. It means opening our

eyes to see those around us who need God's love and grace. It means turning our prayers into action—not praying that someone else take care of the world's problems, but actively working to bring peace and joy in this corner of the world.

Seek happiness and joy. Take responsibility for what needs done in your life and in the community. Open your eyes and look around. Soak in the beauty of God's creation. Appreciate and love your family. Live in a way that your happiness and joy are shared with others. Amen.






