



Person 1: Yeah. And that doesn't seem right. I believe God blesses everyone no matter what.

Person 2: Exactly. So maybe what you mean when you say you feel blessed is that you're just lucky.

Person 1: Well, no, that doesn't seem right either. Because I know everything comes from God.

Person 2: Agreed. So is it a blessing then?

Person 1: Well yes. And...maybe it's more than that?

Person 2: More how?

Person 1: I was just thinking about the story of God talking to Abraham and how God said God would bless Abraham to be a blessing to others.

Person 2: So it wasn't just like Abraham hit the divine Powerball and he got to live it up, basking in God's favor.

Person 1: Nope. Abraham had a job to do. A big one. He had to go out and be a blessing to the world.

Person 2: He kinda blew that more than once.

Person 1 (laughing): True enough. But you get my point.

Person 2: So maybe when things are going well for us, it is a blessing but only because we are supposed to act out of gratitude by blessing others.

Person 1: Doesn't that make more sense?

Person 2: It does. I still think people overuse the word "blessed" and I still think most of them use it to mean "lucky" or "happy."

Person 1: From now on, I'm gonna use it to mean "called."

Person 2: Ooh! I like that! In that case, I feel blessed, too.

Person 1: That's great! What makes you feel blessed?

Person 2: Oh, you know, that even though I lost my job and my kids are struggling, I am not alone.

Person 1: Whoa. You are dealing with all that? And you still feel blessed?

Person 2: What were we just saying? Yes. I feel blessed. Because in spite of all that is going on in my life, there are things that are going well for me and I can be a blessing to other people no matter what.

Person 1: Yeah. Okay. Sorry. I was just surprised. I guess it's pretty deeply ingrained to think about being blessed only when things are going well.

Person 2: It does take work to see things differently than popular culture or conventional wisdom would have you see them.

Person 1: Worth it, though. Next time I go through a rough patch—and you know I will, because everyone does—I'll try to remember to see how I'm still blessed.

Person 2: Cool. How 'bout you bless me with your company and we go grab a cup of coffee.

Person 1: Sounds like a plan.

SERMON

Rev. Becky Erb Strang

The skit we just heard and saw talks about being a blessing to others—that no matter the circumstances of our lives, we are blessed by God. And in response to God's blessings, we are called to be a blessing to others. During the Epiphany season we talk about being the Light of Christ to others. During Easter season we talk about offering new life to others through the Risen Christ.

In today's scripture lesson, in this extended Pentecost season, we hear the story of God calling Abram (Abraham) to leave everything behind in order to follow God to the Promised Land. God also promises that, through Abraham, everyone (that means all!) will know God's blessings.

Be the Light. Offer New Life to Others. Be a Blessing. All of these images/phrases set us on the path of discipleship—following God by following Jesus. Our Bible is chock-full of stories of discipleship: being called by God for service in our world. Our faith community is, at its very core, a communal life of service to others: Loving God and Loving our Neighbors. In other words: Discipleship. Christian Discipleship.

Yet, it is our confession that we wander away from our calling. It is our confession that we would rather nurse our wounded hearts rather than offer forgiveness. It is our confession that we tend toward violence and prejudice and oppression rather than doing as Jesus demands: loving our enemies and turning the other cheek. And when it comes to blessings, we tend to treat them as if they are commodities to squirrel away instead of to share extravagantly.

Being a blessing, being a disciple of Jesus, does not mean we are perfect or have our lives in order. Far from it. Over and over again, the Bible tells stories of God calling the most improbably imperfect people to carry out his work. It is the same for each of us. WE are called because we are loved. We are loved because we belong to God. And, because we belong to God, we are sent out to share his blessings, his love, his grace with everyone. Absolutely everyone.

What good news! No matter who you are or where you are in life's journey, you are called to a life of discipleship, a life of service, a life of offering blessing and light to others.

This sounds off-topic, but it is not. Who here has done crafts with glitter at some point in your life? Have you ever tried to clean up that glitter afterwards? Almost impossible, huh? Even when we think we've wiped up the very last of that shiny stuff, weeks later we'll still find it in some random room of our house or even clinging to our foreheads.

Maybe that's what God's blessings are like. Perhaps at birth we were given a bag full of glitter by God: the glitter of love and faith and hope and forgiveness. The glitter of grace and peace and the Holy Spirit. We might TRY to keep God's blessings (that bag of glitter) all to ourselves, but it never works that way. God's blessings, God's glitter, God's love, spills out of that glitter/life-bag: no matter how hard we try to keep it tucked safely away.

What would happen if we simply let our lives shine with the Light, the Love, the Glitter that God has given to us? What would happen if we dug deep into that bag and began to scatter glitter everywhere we went? What might our lives look like if we made a conscious effort to scatter joy and love and light at every turn—even in difficult times?

Abraham took that first scary step, packing up his life and his family and heading toward the Promised Land. Yes, he made some spectacular mistakes along the way, but God never withdrew or withheld his blessing. Everywhere Abraham traveled, he became a blessing to others simply because he was chosen.

The same is true for each of us. You are chosen by God for a mission, a calling, a life that is unique to you. You are loved by God—always. That love is never withdrawn or withheld. You have been gifted with a bag-full of blessings (and possibly glitter).

The choice is yours to make. Will you squirrel away your blessings/God's glitter OR will you let that glorious stuff scatter everywhere you go?


Let's get out and make this community sparkle and shine with love. Amen.


