Use this resource at home to guide your household's daily devotions.



Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Holy God, with the angels we rejoice at Jesus' birth. Give us the eagerness of the shepherds to tell all the world of your limitless love. Amen.

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. (Luke 2:16-18)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

The shepherds kept moving through this story, even as it got weirder and scarier. But God becoming human deserves nothing less.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- What occupations are the most prestigious in your community? Which are the least prestigious? Where does your occupation lie on the spectrum? Would God send angels to share the good news with you? Why or why not?
- What has been the biggest surprise of this year? How has it shaped you?
- For the littles: Besides Jesus, what was the best gift you received this season? (Remember, the gift might not be a toy— it might be an experience, a relationship, or someone doing something with you.) God's best gift is you!

Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.



CHRISTMAS EVE SCRIPTURE LESSON: Luke 2:1-20 (The Message)

About that time Caesar Augustus ordered a census to be taken throughout the Empire. This was the first census when Quirinius was governor of Syria. Everyone had to travel to his own ancestral hometown to be accounted for. So Joseph went from the Galilean town of Nazareth up to Bethlehem in Judah, David's town, for the census. As a descendant of David, he had to go there. He went with Mary, his fiancée, who was pregnant.

⁶⁻⁷ While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. She gave birth to a son, her firstborn. She wrapped him in a blanket and laid him in a manger, because there was no room in the hostel.

⁸⁻¹² There were shepherds camping in the neighborhood. They had set night watches over their sheep. Suddenly, God's angel stood among them and God's glory blazed around them. They were terrified. The angel said, "Don't be afraid. I'm here to announce a great and joyful event that is meant for everybody, worldwide: A Savior has just been born in David's town, a Savior who is Messiah and Master. This is what you're to look for: a baby wrapped in a blanket and lying in a manger."

¹³⁻¹⁴ At once the angel was joined by a huge angelic choir singing God's praises: Glory to God in the heavenly heights,

Peace to all men and women on earth who please him.

¹⁵⁻¹⁸ As the angel choir withdrew into heaven, the shepherds talked it over. "Let's get over to Bethlehem as fast as we can and see for ourselves what God has revealed to us." They left, running, and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. Seeing was believing. They told everyone they met what the angels had said about this child. All who heard the shepherds were impressed.

¹⁹⁻²⁰ Mary kept all these things to herself, holding them dear, deep within herself. The shepherds returned and let loose, glorifying and praising God for everything they had heard and seen. It turned out exactly the way they'd been told!

SERMON

Throughout the Advent season, our worship included music from the movie *The Muppet Christmas Carol*. It is a 1992 retelling of Charles Dickens' novella of the same name (minus the Muppet part, of course!)

I chose the music and the story because they serve as a metaphor for the Christmas season. The entire movie/story/musical is about love. Tonight, we have gathered to celebrate that the birth of Jesus is God's love enfleshed/incarnate/moving amongst us. Wherever you find love, it feels like Christmas. Indeed, Christmas is about love. Always.

The birth of Jesus serves as a powerful witness to God's love. God comes to us, not as an angry and vengeful god. Nor does he come to oppress or enslave. God's love sets us free. God's love frees us to live joyfully and generously—not miserly and miserable. We are **not** following Jesus when we act as Ebenezer Scrooge did before his nighttime ghostly visitors.

Christmas is about love. For many of us, this is difficult to fathom. We, who struggle with love, often cannot imagine that God loves us so much that he chooses to be born among us. And not just born among us—but born to a young woman, engaged to a carpenter. Love, God shows us, is about humility and generosity, and justice.

Theologian Richard Rohr once wrote, "God is always more loving than the person who has loved us most."

So, I ask you this night: Who has loved you most?

How did you experience that love?

What was your response to that kind of love?

The good news the angels sang to the shepherds is this: no matter how little or how much you have experienced love in your life, God loves you more. Much, much more.

On this night of love incarnate, of love enfleshed, of love born among us, we are called to BE love to others in our homes, our church, our villages, our nation and our world.

Yet our confession on Christmas Eve is this: we are a nation divided in a world divided. There is conflict and violence in our neighborhoods and in our homes. Very few of us are at peace with ourselves. Christmas Eve reminds us that it need not be this way. Because the Prince of Peace was born on this holy night, Love will have the final word. Always.

So, what can we do with this gift given to us—the birth of the Christ Child? We can be loving—loving God, loving our neighbors, and loving ourselves. As Jesus followers, we are challenged to BE love in the days ahead. Reconcile with someone with whom you are estranged. Reach out to a neighborhood child who seems lost. Offer kindness and peace rather than bitterness and biting sarcasm.

On this night, Love is born in our midst. Love incarnate in Baby Jesus. Remember—he did not stay a baby (as much as we might like him to). He grew into a man who spent his ministry fighting for those on the margins, healing the broken, and standing up against oppressive religious and political systems. On this holy night, celebrate a birth of a baby whose story we already know: Love Incarnate was arrested, tried, and nailed onto a cross to die like a common criminal.

But, we also know that is not the end of the story. We celebrate the birth of Jesus because his death was not the final word. Three days later, Jesus rose from the dead as a reminder that while death and evil and oppression might seem to have their day, ultimately love wins. Love wins.

So tonight, on this holy night, we join with the angels and archangels, the lowly shepherds, and the wise magi in singing songs of joy for unto us a child is born—born for love!



OFFERING THE LIGHT

CHRISTMAS LESSON: Hebrews 1:1-12

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, ² but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. ³ He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustain all things by his powerful word. CHRISTMAS LESSON: Luke 2:22-40

(The Message) Then when the days stipulated by Moses for purification were complete, they took him up to Jerusalem to offer him to God as commanded in God's Law: "Every male who opens the womb shall be a holy offering to God," and also to sacrifice the "pair of doves or two young pigeons" prescribed in God's Law.

²⁵⁻³² In Jerusalem at the time, there was a man, Simeon by name, a good man, a man who lived in the prayerful expectancy of help for Israel. And the Holy Spirit was on him. The Holy Spirit had shown him that he would see the Messiah of God before he died. Led by the Spirit, he entered the Temple. As the parents of the child Jesus brought him in to carry out the rituals of the Law, Simeon took him into his arms and blessed God:

God, you can now release your servant; release me in peace as you promised.

- With my own eyes I've seen your salvation; it's now out in the open for everyone to see:
- A God-revealing light to the non-Jewish nations, and of glory for your people Israel.
- ³³⁻³⁵ Jesus' father and mother were speechless with surprise at these words. Simeon went on to bless them, and said to Mary his mother,
- This child marks both the failure and
 - the recovery of many in Israel,
- A figure misunderstood and contradicted—
- the pain of a sword-thrust through you—
- But the rejection will force honesty,
 - as God reveals who they really are.

³⁶⁻³⁸ Anna the prophetess was also there, a daughter of Phanuel from the tribe of Asher. She was by now a very old woman. She had been married seven years and a widow for eighty-four. She never left the Temple area, worshiping night and day with her fastings and prayers. At the very time Simeon was praying, she showed up, broke into an anthem of praise to God, and talked about the child to all who were waiting expectantly for the freeing of Jerusalem.

³⁹⁻⁴⁰ When they finished everything required by God in the Law, they returned to Galilee and their own town, Nazareth. There the child grew strong in body and wise in spirit. And the grace of God was on him.






