Bryan Trego made a motion to replace the parsonage upstairs air conditioner/furnace and add the air purifier for a total cost of \$9,940.00. Lindsey Quellhorst second, motion passed.

Outside/Inside Sanctuary South Window: There is a crack in the cement façade at the top of the window, letting water seep inside. This is causing the plaster inside at the top of the arch to crack/crumble and fall off. Roland and John will work on fixing both outside and inside.

Website Upgrade: Our website hosts Agile technology have enhancements/upgrades available such as live streaming services. Quote to upgrade is \$799.00. Decision was tabled until next month.

Vacation Policy: Vacation policy has not been reviewed for at least 15 years. Updates were made and presented. Bryan Trego made the motion to accept the new policy, June Oaks seconded, motion passed.

Lighting Upgrade Chapel/Assembly Room: We have received a donation to change the lights in the Chapel/Assembly room area. We will be removing the old lights and fans. These will be available to anyone who would like for a donation to the current Project of the Year.
