

- 2023 Council Member: Motion was made by Connie Friemering to accept the members and seconded by Cresta Ritter. Motion was passed
- **2023 Explanation of New Constitutional Change:** Constitutional changes under Article V. Administration:
- 6. Council members and officers shall be elected approved at the Congregational Meeting held in December and installed on the first Sunday in January.
- 7. The terms of the offices shall be three years for the Trustees. -and two years for all the others. Two years for Recording Secretary and Treasurer. Elders and Deacons-one year as junior and one year as senior. Vice President (one year and)

will assume the duties of President for the second year of their term. Elections shall be held each year in order to fill vacancies.

Constitutional change was passed by paper ballot.

- **2023 Budget (presented by Myra Hanenkratt):** The budget was reviewed. Changes: increase in operating expenses and 3% raise in staff salaries. Motion was made by Carol Wilson to accept and seconded by Lynda Ranly. Budget was passed by paper ballot
- **Destroying of votes by paper ballot:** Motion was made by Lloyd Schroer and seconded by Neal Voress

Other Business: John Gilberg asked the question regarding a Search Committee for new pastor search. Myra Hanenkratt explained that one will be formed.

Pastor Becky thanked Roland Dicke for his service as Congregational President.

Love God & Love Neighbors. St. Paul Church in 2022 sought to do exactly that through our many and varied ministries.

We continue to offer worship both online and in person. In September, we added Saturday worship in the chapel on communion weekends. Between Deacons, ushers, Elders, musicians and liturgists, worship is vibrant and relevant.

We are also seeking to fill positions for Groundskeeper, Sanctuary Custodian, Music Director, Bell Director, Chancel Choir Director, and Technology Director. A huge heart-felt thank you to Mike Holdren, Greg Hainline, and Jim Strang. Deb Klein, Office Assistant, has also recently resigned.

I thank Dennis Hainline for keeping the education building clean and sanitized. Janet Eilerman counts your financial donations, keeping both records and confidences. John Mohrman's expertise has saved St. Paul Church thousands of dollars in maintenance bills. Abby Bushman's passion for children, youth, and pastoral care is changing lives within our congregation. In 2022 we welcomed Arianne Henry to St. Paul as our worship organist.

I, too, am part of staff transitions. After nearly 14 years of serving as your Senior Pastor and after 29 years of ordained ministry, I am retiring at the end of May. My last Sunday in worship with you is May 21. I thank you for your support and prayers throughout these years of ministry. Together, we have flung open our doors and hearts to the community to share God's love. Thank you!

I have enjoyed getting to know the council members and giving my time to such a worthwhile organization. I am grateful for this opportunity to serve St. Paul's community and God as the Treasurer.

We ended 2022, \$6,669.39 below budget. We did have significant costs increases for the natural gas and electric, as well as the internet for both the church and parsonage. The postage expenses exceeded the budget by \$2621.61. The council collaborated in November to finalize the annual budget for 2023. A detailed analysis was done to compose the most reasonable budget that the council could create based on historical income and expenses. The proposed budget was presented to the congregation for approval. I participated in the Finance Team's meeting with our Edward Jones representative.

On December 31 we lost gas pressure that lead to the replacement of underground gas lines which were replaced in January. The natural gas supply to the sanctuary went bad. Everything from the street to the sanctuary needed replacing. The regulator to the kitchen gas supply in the educational building also needed replacing.

Lima Organ tracked down the source of a bad odor coming from the organ council for a while. They cut a hole in the floor below the organ bench and above the basement ceiling. They found a decomposing possum. Odor is now gone.

Torrence Sound Equipment Company installed a new state of the art sound system and new speakers in the sanctuary.

New LED lights and ceiling fans in the chapel and assembly room installed by New Knoxville Supply in memory of Mildred Browder by Sue and Jerry Maxson.

Large cracking of brickwork on north side of sanctuary repaired.
