

Constitutional Changes under By-Laws. Article II Administration, Section 1. Congregational Business Meetings.

3. A congregational meeting shall be held on the second first Sunday in Advent for the purpose of electing approving new Church Council members. At this meeting, also, a vote shall be taken on the proposed budget for the next year.

Section 2. Church Council – Election

2. The Church Council shall nominate one candidate from the above list of names for each expiring office and present this slate of candidates at the congregational meeting held the second first Sunday in Advent.

Section 4. Duties of the Officers of Church Council

7. Upon approval of the budget by Council, the budget shall be presented to the Congregation the second first Sunday of Advent.

Section 5. Standing Committees of the Church Council

Add the following standing committee of the Church Council:

9. Personnel Team—The Personnel Team will consist of the Senior Pastor, Council President (or their appointee), and two members of the congregation. The congregational members of the team will serve a two-year term and one will chair the team. They are responsible to handle all personnel issues as they arise. This includes finding substitute staff to cover vacations, illness or other leave of absences. They will also conduct staff reviews and renew staff contracts at the beginning of each year as well as interview and hire any staff replacements.
