



The Lord appeared to Abraha by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. ² He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them and bowed down to the ground. ³ He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. ⁴ Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet,

and rest yourselves under the tree. ⁵ Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." ⁶ And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah and said, "Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes." ⁷ Abraham ran to the herd and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it. ⁸ Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared and set it before them, and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

⁹ They said to him, "Where is your wife Sarah?" And he said, "There, in the tent." ¹⁰ Then one said, "I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son." And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him. ¹¹ Now Abraham and Sarah were old, advanced in age; it had ceased to be with Sarah after the manner of women. ¹² So Sarah laughed to herself, saying, "After I have grown old, and my husband is old, shall I be fruitful?" ¹³ The Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Shall I indeed bear a child, now that I am old?' ¹⁴ Is anything too wonderful for the Lord? At the set time I will return to you, in due season, and Sarah shall have a son." ¹⁵ But Sarah denied, saying, "I did not laugh," for she was afraid. He said, "Yes, you did laugh."

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Romans 5:1-8 (NT) pg.155


Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.







*PASSING THE PEACE OF CHRIST

<u>Leader</u>: The peace of Christ be with you

*POSTLUDE

<u>Justification</u> is the act by which God brings people back into proper relationship with God. It is the act of divine forgiveness whereby, because of Christ, an unworthy person no longer has guilt reckoned against them. Accepting that pardon by faith, the unworthy are renewed in their hearts. Faith, and faith alone, is reckoned as righteousness.

But faith is not an intellectual assent to certain doctrines. Here, faith means a basic reorientation of our very selves. Justification by faith implies both a deep, personal appreciation and acceptance for our sins being forgiven because of Jesus' death, and the beginning of a new life by virtue of the power of the Holy Spirit.

Simply put, being Justified means we have been made right with God. We are no longer 'sinners in the hands of an angry God.' Because of

Jesus' death, our sins have been forgiven and we are eager to begin the process of Sanctification.

<u>Sanctification</u> is the process of becoming more like God. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we are released more and more from the compulsive power of sin and guilt and are instead empowered to love God and serve our neighbors. This is the proper response to the joy we experience when we realize we are Justified. Full **Sanctification** is not something we will ever reach in our earthly lives. We are all fallen, sinful people and sin will always be a part of us. But the more we live as God wants us to live, the less power sin will have over us and the more joy we will feel in living Christian lives.
