From the Pastor's Desk

See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them.—Isaiah 42:9

We are a people of story. From the time we are children, we love hearing good stories that capture our imagination and excite us with wonder and possibility. And as we grow older, we need to hear and understand how we are connected to a larger story, a greater narrative than just our individual lives. We love delving into the stories of our ancestral families—and how they left their countries of origin to make it to the United States to find hope and opportunity. And think of how we have been impacted by the stories of our nation's founding—or the defeat of slavery in the Civil War—or marches for suffrage or civil rights. We are a people of story.

As Christians, our foundational story is the event of Christ's resurrection. We are who we are because of the resurrection. The resurrection is the lens through which we view all of life, and understand our collective story of faith. For example, without the resurrection, we would have no Christmas. The world became interested in Jesus' earthly life because of what happened at Easter. We also would have no church. Our weekly worship is a celebration of the power of resurrection in our lives—God's love which triumphs over sin and death—and delivers us to new and everlasting life. And in our personal stories of faith, we not only discover how God's story of resurrection is unfolding within us, but how we are important to God's larger plan of resurrection for the world. So as we journey through the Easter season in April and May, let us rejoice in this great gift and ongoing story of God's love which makes all things new. And as we make our way through this interim period, we also have the opportunity to celebrate God's faithfulness and power to make us new, through our church. Nearly nine years ago, God brought together three congregations to create something new— Community of Faith United Church of Christ. God has a story to tell through us, too! During the spring, we will highlight the legacy of Community of Faith U.C.C.—in our personal stories—and in our shared journey of discipleship with Jesus Christ. Our story is not finished, it is still ongoing! There are more adventures of hope and faith to come! So please watch our bulletins and newsletters to learn about upcoming opportunities to learn, grow, and rejoice in God's story lived through us!

May God bless us and continue transforming us in the ongoing story of resurrection!

# Finding Hope in Times of Change in the Church Monday, April 22, 1 to 3 p.m.

# Call to Order

At 6:30 pm Pastor Delisa Buckingham-Taylor opened the meeting by leading the team as we recited our newly-created Joint Leadership Covenant of Loving Care and Trust and the Prayer of St. Francis in unison.

# **Team Building Lesson**

Pastor Delisa began with sharing an article from Nayiri Karjin, General Manager, Living Water Association, dealing with disagreement and conflict throughout the ages. We discussed what we need to learn about handling conflict. We reviewed an article from Mennonite Church USA, addressing how to deal with conflict and reviewed levels of surveying the landscape and stages of conflict.

Pastor Delisa identified four factors regarding conflict: Maintaining Status Quo, Grief, Progression of Conflict, Process and Communication.

Discussion question: "What is the single most important thing our church has contributed to in our lives." After we shared personal experiences, Pastor Delisa shared what she sees in us: "tremendous sincerity of faith and an earnest desire to live the faith fully." She commented she believes in us, and knows we can work through conflicts to get where we want to be.

We closed the Lesson by reciting The Serenity Prayer.

There is a large profit at end of February due to the incoming transfer of the Christian Education Director salary from the Endowment/Investment funds. The transfer appears to indicate a big profit. However, those funds will dwindle over time as the salary is paid.

Greg Vrona posed a question regarding end of year balances for restricted funds. Finance team offered explanation and will be reviewing that process and considering something to educate members and helping them understand.

A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Greg Vrona, seconded by Annette Blackshire and carried with a unanimous vote.

## **Finance Team**

Team audited the Financial Secretary, Treasurer and the Endowment/Investment accounts. All were found in good order and will be documented and forwarded to the clerk.

## **Nominations Team Report**

Carol Struck met with Jayna Anderson, and now knows what needs to be done. She will assemble a team to begin the tasks at hand.

## **Old Business**

Don secured the Ohio State Certificate for continued existence. It's been updated and will be stored in the Policy and Procedures Manual.

Don shared contents of our Suggestion Box. Each suggestion will be addressed individually.

Terry Trakas shared his process of updating the directory and will share information via an announcement during Sunday Worship.

Don is planning to meet with Jesse Grabowski concerning insurance issues with the charter of scouts and our church.

The defibrillator has been activated and plans are being made to secure training regarding using it.

Don is contemplating and will have further discussions with the team to determine how to obtain input from the congregation regarding air conditioning in the Sanctuary.

Jared Trakas submitted a fundraising proposal for the Worship and Music Team to have their Spaghetti Dinner on April 13. A motion was made by Carol Struck, seconded by Dan Hall and carried with a unanimous vote to approve the Fund Raising application.

# **Endowment Report**

On behalf of the Endowment Team, Jim Ketchum recommended the following fund requests be considered by the Executive Team:

- \$649.89 from the Women of Faith to complete the restroom renovation project. A motion was made by Terry Trakas, seconded by Dan Hall and carried unanimously to approve this disbursement.
- Up to \$3000.00 of Dollar-for Dollar matching funds for the gross proceeds of the Worship and Music Team's Spaghetti Dinner to be given to The Office on Aging

   Safe at Home Program. A motion was made by Terry Trakas, seconded by Greg Vrona and carried with a unanimous vote to approve this disbursement.
- We have received the 2024 grant from the Lorain County Community Foundation in the amount of \$2,675.00. We request the Executive Team approve the disbursement of these funds to the Good Sam Fund pending receipt of a fund request. A motion was made by Karen Ennes, seconded by Linda Collins and carried with a unanimous vote to approve this disbursement.
- We received a bequest from Dale Yost in the amount of \$25,000.00 earmarked for the Endowment Fund. Pastor Delisa has sent a thank you on behalf of Community of Faith.
- Upon his resignation, a thank you gift was given to Jim Ketchum, on behalf of Community of Faith, with appreciation for his excellent service over the years. Jim responded with a wish for the very best for the church and a hope for the church to be fruitful in the progress we're making. He expressed his pleasure while working with us.

# Executive Session (8:55 pm)

Executive team went into Executive Session of a confidential nature regarding appointments for Transition Team and appointment of Endowment Chairperson.

After lengthy discussion and consideration of two candidates, the Executive Team unanimously voted to appoint Andy Behm to the position of Endowment/Investments Team Chairman.

Meeting was closed by reciting The Lord's Prayer together.


