From the Pastor's Desk:

May 2024

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. (Acts 1:6-9)

I recently read an online article from the pastor/blogger Skye Jethani (holypost.com), who retold a story about Dallas Willard, a noted philosopher, author and teacher of Christian spirituality at the University of Southern California (USC).

One day toward the end of a class session, a student who was feeling antagonistic and quite full of himself, challenged Willard and told him he disagreed with him on various points. Willard knew the student was wrong in his understanding, and could have put the student in his place. Instead, Willard said, "Well, I think that's a good place for the class to end. Let's stop there, and then we will pick it up next time."

After the class session, another student asked Willard, "Why did you do that, because you could have just let the guy have it? Why didn't you let him have it?"

Willard's response was, "I'm practicing the discipline of not having the last word." By not responding to the arrogant student, Willard was denying the student the satisfaction of picking a fight. But Willard also was denying himself the satisfaction of winning—which he could have done with his mastery of the subject.

It's tempting for us to want to have the last word. But, as satisfying as we think it feels to put someone in their place, having the last word diminishes both of us. When we have the last word, we humiliate the other person, and, we demonstrate a lack of self-control and personal humility. We also display a lack of respect and kindness for the other person. By getting the last word in, we also take the risk of starting or escalating a conflict. When someone feels humiliated, they want to get even.

The pastor/blogger Skye Jethani shared this story to help his readers prepare for this election season, when political opponents, and families, friends, and online acquaintances will seek to best each other by having the last word and publicly humiliating them, whether it's through social media, letters to the editor, or community forums. We have the opportunity to reduce the temperature of political discourse by our handling of contentious discussions. Just because someone wants to provoke us, doesn't mean we have to respond in kind.

But we know that wanting to have the last word is also a dynamic in our marriages, families, workplaces, meetings, churches, and more. If we are followers of Jesus Christ, we recognize that the desire for having the last word isn't a Christian virtue. As the Apostle Paul describes in Galatians 5: 16-26, such desires and behavior are opposed to the work of the Holy Spirit. Specifically, in verses 22-23, Paul states that the fruits of the Holy Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There's no "having the last word" in that list!

That doesn't mean we allow ourselves to be doormats. Dallas Willard set a limit on the type of discussion he would allow in his class that day. Jesus also set limits. We can set appropriate boundaries for our personal dignity and safety, and for that of our families and communities, recognizing everyone's need for respect and kindness.

The Holy Spirit is Christ's presence and authority given to his disciples at Pentecost to empower us, the Church, to continue his ministry in his name. We are called to be healers with Christ, for God, and between peoples and nations. As we approach the holy day and season of Pentecost (which begins May 19), let us join those first disciples in praying for the Holy Spirit to rest upon us and fill us, so that we can carry Christ's presence of healing, peace and love, out into the world. After all, in the hope and new life of resurrection, it is God who has the last word!

GOOD SAM FUND UPDATE

For those new members in our church, just a little bit of background. The Good Samaritan Fund was 'established' here at Community of Faith in 2017. It was a combined effort of the three churches that consolidated - with each church having had similar funds/efforts at their church. Because the combined financial resources took some time to smooth out, we had a couple fundraising projects to get us started.

The fund targets 'specific' needs, such as rental assistance, medical assistance, infant needs, food, and personal items. Those requiring assistance make an appointment with

the minister who helps with counseling and sorting out what and where we can help. Generally, our assistance is one or two times, no longer than three in a given period. Emergency exemptions can apply.

The office/minister has had a list of other resources within the county that the recipient can contact. The minister then contacts the Good Sam committee, but confidentially - we don't know the names, just the request. There have been a few bumps along the way, one of which is we need to work on an updated list of resources and food distribution sites. Because of ministerial changes, twice now we have had to use the assistance of Fr. Charlie at St. Mary's until such time as we again have a settled pastor. Currently our interim minister, Delisa, assists with requests that have come from our congregation specifically, and other requests (within the larger community) are sent to Fr. Charlie - his team has been incredibly helpful. Since our inception the Good Samaritan Fund has issued \$11,442.59 to assist those in need in our community and congregation. This year to date we have already expended \$2,535.30 in assistance.

The need for this type of assistance will always be with us, and these special types of situations could happen to many individuals in our midst. **We are extremely grateful for the support of the congregation, the Endowment Fund, and St. Mary's church. You truly exemplify being a Good Samaritan.**

Call to Order
